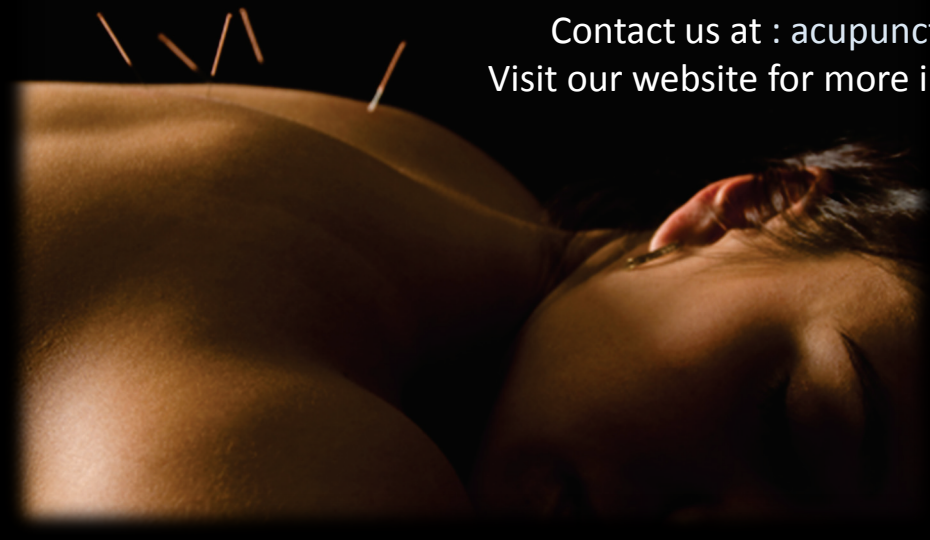

2012 LEVEL 1 MEDICAL ACUPUNCTURE PROGRAM

LEVEL 1 CURRICULUM

Level 1: An Evidence Based Approach (100 hours)

This fundamental level introduces the basic concepts of acupuncture treatment including the neuroanatomical, evidence-based and basic meridian approach to common musculoskeletal conditions. Safety issues and potential complications from acupuncture treatments will be discussed. There will be ample opportunities to practice safe needling in small group sessions and visualize various acupuncture points in the anatomy lab.

Course 1A20. Basic Concepts of Acupuncture

Introductory course on the theories of Medical Acupuncture

- Emphasis and discussions on evidence-based reviews of protocols used in clinical studies
- Demonstrations of location of set acupuncture points
- Students will have the opportunity to practice safe needling techniques
- Pre-requisite to all courses in Level 1 & 2

Course 1B20 and 1C20. Axial Skeletal & Extremities Problems

- Familiarize students with common acupuncture points (e.g. for headaches, neck, back, upper limb and lower limb problems)
- Presentations and discussions will be based on clinical trials on these common acupuncture points
- Students will have the chance to visualize point locations on cadaver specimens in McMaster's anatomy lab and practice needling techniques in a small group setting

Course 1D20 & 1E20. Applications of Acupuncture

- Problem-based approach, applications and special techniques (with web-based and/or self study components)



CERTIFICATE OF ATTENDANCE

Upon successful completion of level 1 and its comprehensive examination, students will receive an official McMaster University Continuing Health Sciences Education (CHSE) **Medical Acupuncture Certificate of Attendance**.

No certificate will be given for partial completion of any level.
